In April 2017, our Central Region Career Exploration Center at Evans Way completed construction of a 10,000 square foot fitness & walking area at the Career Exploration Center. It features a soft walking track as well as basketball half court and several pieces of stationary equipment. This area will be used for exercise, games & large group activities. In addition, Evans Way is working to enhance habilitations with skill building activities such as hotel hospitality, where individuals can gain experience working in a hotel environment which will build marketable skills for employment. The Bell spa will feature opportunities for individuals to gain experience in the health & beauty industry as well as offer services for individuals to use Bell Bucks to get a manicure, hair braid, temporary color, or hair accessory.
